

READ AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE!

The fantasy and science fiction writer Terry Pratchett first published a story in his school magazine, at the age of 13. Later, he sold the story, which was about people trying to sell homes in hell, to a science fiction magazine for £14, with which he bought his first typewriter.



Terry's mother was Irish and loved telling stories – a gift she passed on to her son. Although she pushed Terry to study hard, and he had read almost all the books in the library, he didn't do well at school. He decided to leave at 17 to become a journalist on a local newspaper, the perfect place where he could learn to be a writer. "I understood that it's very difficult to earn a salary by writing fantasy and science fiction, but working for a newspaper meant money every week. I went to the local paper to find out more, and they gave me the job! When I told my parents, they were pleased that I had found a workplace where I didn't get my hands dirty." There, he wrote stories for the children's page.

His advice to young writers is first of all, to read as much as possible, then he suggests keeping a diary to remember where you've been, and who you've met, and what you thought and felt. But, he also says, "Don't forget to make grammar, punctuation and spelling a part of your life."
